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Sundaram Finance arm to acquire Capitalgate

Chennai: The board of Sundaram Finance Ltd (SFL) has granted in-principle approval for the acquisition of research firm Capitalgate Investment Advisors Pvt (CGIA) by Sundaram Alternate Assets Ltd (SAAL), a wholly owned subsidiary of Sundaram Asset Management Company Ltd (SAMCL), which in turn is a wholly owned subsidiary of SFL.

The acquisition will be made for a cash consideration of Rs 35 crore, at a price of Rs 1,060.60 per share, giving SAAL 100% ownership in CGIA. The transaction is expected to be completed within a month.

After completion of the acquisition, CGIA will be amalgamated with SAAL, SFL informed the stock exchanges on Monday. CGIA is developing an AI-based research engine capable of delivering real-time insights, which could make it a valuable business in the future — both financially and as a value addition to Sundaram Alternates' (SAA) funds business, the company said.

In a separate filing, the NBFC Sundaram Finance reported a 15.9% rise in standalone profit after tax (PAT) at Rs 394 crore for the quarter ended Sept 30, 2025, against Rs 340 crore in the corresponding quarter last year. Disbursements grew 12% year-on-year to Rs 15,423 crore in Q2 FY26 from Rs 13,768 crore a year earlier. TNN

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Sundaram Fin's Q2 consolidated PAT jumps 12% to ₹488 crore

Sundaram Finance Ltd (SFL), the NBFC from the TSF Group, on Monday reported consolidated net profit at ₹488 crore for the quarter ended September 2025 (Q2FY26), a 12 per cent year-on-year (y-o-y) growth on the back of increased disbursements, driven by this year's festive season. Consolidated revenue from operations for the quarter grew 14 per cent, to ₹2,386 crore.

The consolidated results of SFL include the results of its subsidiaries — Sundaram Home Finance, Sundaram Asset Management and joint

venture company Royal Sundaram General Insurance.

On a standalone basis, Sundaram Finance logged a disbursement growth of 18 per cent, to ₹8,113 crore, in Q2. Assets under management (AUM) grew 15.3 per cent y-o-y, to ₹55,419 crore.

Standalone PAT for Q2 closed at ₹ 394 crore, up from ₹304 crore in the same quarter last year. Net interest income (NII) grew in Q2FY26 grew 21 per cent, to ₹822 crore.

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Sundaram Finance nets Rs 823 cr profit in H1FY26

CHENNAI: Sundaram Finance reported highest-ever disbursements of Rs 15,423 crores with Q2 growth of 18 per cent at Rs 8,113 crore.

“Q2FY26 started with continuing macroeconomic sluggishness witnessed over the past few quarters. The introduction of GST 2.0 reforms and the country’s rating upgrade by global rating agencies have boosted overall sentiments over the past 4-6 weeks. Team Sundaram has delivered 15.3 per cent growth in AUM to Rs 55,419 crore, asset quality with net stage 3 assets at

1.13 per cent vs 0.89 per cent last year and profits after tax growth of 27 per cent year-on-year,” said Harsha Viji, executive vice chairman.

He also said the group companies in asset management, general insurance and home finance have continued to record strong results.

Disbursements for H1FY26 re-

corded a growth of 12 per cent over H1FY25 and for Q2FY26, disbursements have grown 18 per cent Y-o-Y. Gross stage 3 assets as on September 30, 2025, stood at 2.03 per cent with provision cover of 45 per cent as against 1.62 per cent as on September 30, 2024, with provision cover of 45 per cent.

Profit after tax registered a 27

per cent rise in H1FY26, with net profit at Rs 823 crore and for Q2, PAT grew 16 per cent to Rs 394 crore.

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Sundaram Fin profit rises 16% on strong disburseals

SUNDARAM FINANCE ON Monday reported a 16% year-on-year rise in its standalone net profit for the second quarter at ₹394.2 crore, driven by higher disbursements during the festive season.

The NBFC reported an 18% increase in revenue from operations to ₹1,615 crore. Disbursements grew 18% to ₹8,113 crore, from ₹6,860 crore in the year-ago period. Net interest income rose 21% to ₹822 crore.

“The festival period has been strong,” MD Rajiv Lochan said, adding that the company expects the impact of GST 2.0 on consumption to be buoyant, rural demand to improve after a healthy monsoon, and private sector capex to pick up in the coming quarters. “Consequently, our post-festival outlook for Q3 and H2 is optimistic.”

Assets under management (AUM) grew 15% to ₹55,419 crore as of September 2025, compared with ₹48,058 crore a year earlier.

However, the asset quality witnessed some pressure, with gross Stage 3 assets rising to 2.03% from 1.62% in September 2024. Net Stage 3 assets increased to 1.13% from 0.89% in the same period.

At the consolidated level, Sundaram Finance reported a 12% year-on-year increase in



net profit to ₹488 crore in Q2, supported by a 14% rise in consolidated revenue from operations to ₹2,386 crore.

The consolidated numbers include the performance of its subsidiaries — Sundaram Home Finance, Sundaram Asset Management, and joint venture Royal Sundaram General Insurance.

“Our group companies in asset management, general insurance and home finance have continued to record strong results. We continue to rely on our time-tested approach of steady and sustainable growth with best-in-class asset quality and consistent profitability,” said Harsha Viji, executive vice chairman.

The company reported its highest-ever disbursements of ₹15,423 crore in H1FY26, reflecting a 12% year-on-year increase. Consolidated AUM across the lending and general insurance businesses rose 15% year-on-year to ₹83,586 crore while the AUM of the asset management business stood at ₹82,608 crore, up

from ₹76,845 crore in September 2024.

The board approved the acquisition of Capitalgate Investment Advisors by Sundaram Alternate Assets for a consideration of ₹35 crore. Shares of Sundaram Finance closed 2% higher at ₹4,691 on the NSE.

City Union Bank profit rises 15%

City Union Bank on Monday reported a 15% year-on-year rise in net profit for the second quarter at ₹329 crore, driven by higher interest income. The lender's interest income grew 15% to ₹1,653 crore during the quarter, while net interest income increased 14% to ₹667 crore. The net interest margin stood at 3.63%, slightly lower than 3.67% in the same period last year.

Total deposits rose 21% year-on-year to ₹69,486 crore during the quarter under review, outpacing advances growth of 18% to ₹57,561 crore.
